
September 2022 compared with August 2022

## Production in construction up by 0.1% in euro area and by 0.2% in EU

Up by 1.0% and 1.4% compared with September 2021

In September 2022 compared with August 2022, seasonally adjusted production in the construction sector increased by 0.1% in the **euro area** and by 0.2% in the **EU**, according to first estimates from **Eurostat, the statistical office of the European Union**. In August 2022, production in construction fell by 1.0% in the **euro area** and by 0.9% in the **EU**.

In September 2022 compared with September 2021, production in construction increased by 1.0% in the **euro area** and by 1.4% in the **EU**.



## **Monthly comparison by construction sector and by Member State**

In the **euro area** in September 2022, compared with August 2022, building construction increased by 0.1% and civil engineering by 0.6%.

In the **EU**, civil engineering increased by 1.5%, while building construction decreased by 0.1%.

Among Member States for which data are available, the highest monthly increases in production in construction were recorded in **Romania** (+3.2%), **Sweden** (+2.8%) and **Hungary** (+2.2%). The largest decreases were observed in **Poland** (-5.8%), **Portugal** (-2.7%) and **Austria** (-2.6%).

## **Annual comparison by construction sector and by Member State**

In the **euro area** in September 2022, compared with September 2021, building construction increased by 1.2% and civil engineering by 0.2%.

In the **EU** building construction increased by 1.4% and civil engineering by 1.3%.

Among Member States for which data are available, the highest annual increases in production in construction were observed in **Romania** (+26.2%), **Slovenia** (+26.1%) and **Austria** (+6.3%). The largest decreases were recorded in **Spain** (-12.3%), **Czechia** (-3.7%) and **Germany** (-2.6%).

## **Geographical information**

The **euro area** (EA19) includes Belgium, Germany, Estonia, Ireland, Greece, Spain, France, Italy, Cyprus, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, the Netherlands, Austria, Portugal, Slovenia, Slovakia and Finland.

The **European Union** (EU27) includes Belgium, Bulgaria, Czechia, Denmark, Germany, Estonia, Ireland, Greece, Spain, France, Croatia, Italy, Cyprus, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Hungary, Malta, the Netherlands, Austria, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovenia, Slovakia, Finland and Sweden.

Estonia, Greece, Croatia, Cyprus, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg and Malta are not required to supply monthly data within 1 month and 15 days after the end of the reference month under Regulation (EU) 2019/2152. Ireland has a derogation to remain with quarterly frequency and Denmark to have a longer deadline until the end of 2023.

## **Methods and definitions**

The **index of production in construction** approximates the evolution of the volume of production within the sector, broken down into building construction and civil engineering.

**Seasonally adjusted** euro area and EU series are calculated by aggregating the seasonally adjusted national data. Eurostat carries out the seasonal adjustment of the data for those countries that do not adjust their data for seasonal effects.

The monthly index as presented in this News Release is calculated only on the basis of the data of those countries reporting monthly data. Missing observations from Member States for recent months are estimated for the calculation of the euro area and the EU aggregates.

## **Revisions and timetable**

Data of previous months have been revised compared with those issued in News Release [117/2022](#) of 19 October 2022. The monthly percentage change for August 2022 was revised from -0.6% to -1.0% in the euro area and from -0.4% to -0.9% in the EU. The annual percentage change has been revised from +2.3% to +2.0% in the euro area and from +2.8% to +2.3% in the EU.



## Production in construction up by 1.3% in both the euroarea and the EU

Up by 2.2% and 2.4% compared with October 2021

In October 2022 compared with September 2022, seasonally adjusted production in the construction sector increased by 1.3% in both the **euro area** and the **EU**, according to first estimates from **Eurostat, the statistical office of the European Union**. In September 2022, production in construction rose by 0.5% in the **euro area** and by 0.3% in the **EU**.

In October 2022 compared with October 2021, production in construction increased by 2.2% in the **euro area** and by 2.4% in the **EU**.



## **Monthly comparison by construction sector and by Member State**

In the **euro area** in October 2022, compared with September 2022, building construction increased by 1.3% and civil engineering by 1.0%.

In the **EU**, building construction increased by 1.3% and civil engineering by 0.1%.

Among Member States for which data are available, the highest monthly increases in production in construction were recorded in **Slovenia** (+8.5%), **Romania** (+5.5%) and **Poland** (+5.0%). Decreases were observed in **Hungary** (-1.8%), **Portugal** and **Finland** (both -0.7%), **Sweden** (-0.4%) and **Spain** (-0.3%).

## **Annual comparison by construction sector and by Member State**

In the **euro area** in October 2022, compared with October 2021, building construction increased by 2.3% and civil engineering by 1.9%.

In the **EU** building construction increased by 2.4% and civil engineering by 1.7%.

Among Member States for which data are available, the highest annual increases in production in construction were observed in **Slovenia** (+54.6%), **Romania** (+34.4%) and **Poland** (+3.9%). Decreases were recorded in **Hungary** (-20.1%), **Spain** (-9.7%), **Belgium** (-1.6%) and **Slovakia** (-0.1%).


November 2022 compared with October 2022

## Production in construction down by 0.8% in the euro area and by 0.4% in the EU

Up by 1.3% and 1.8% compared with November 2021

In November 2022 compared with October 2022, seasonally adjusted production in the construction sector decreased by 0.8% in the **euro area** and by 0.4% in the **EU**, according to first estimates from **Eurostat, the statistical office of the European Union**. In October 2022, production in construction rose by 1.0% in both the **euro area** and the **EU**.

In November 2022 compared with November 2021, production in construction increased by 1.3% in the **euro area** and by 1.8% in the **EU**.



### Monthly comparison by construction sector and by Member State

In the **euro area** in November 2022, compared with October 2022, building construction decreased by 0.9%, while civil engineering increased by 0.4%.

In the **EU**, building construction decreased by 0.6%, while civil engineering increased by 1.0%.

Among Member States for which data are available, the largest monthly decreases in production in construction were recorded in **Slovenia** (-3.4%), **Germany** (-2.2%) and **Slovakia** (-2.0%). The highest increases were observed in **Hungary** (+6.8%), **Poland** (+2.5%) and **Belgium** (+1.6%).

## Annual comparison by construction sector and by Member State

In the **euro area** in November 2022, compared with November 2021, civil engineering increased by 1.7% and building construction by 1.2%.

In the **EU** civil engineering increased by 2.8% and building construction by 1.6%.

Among Member States for which data are available, the highest annual increases in production in construction were observed in **Slovenia** (+44.0%), **Romania** (+20.4%) and **Belgium** (+12.9%). The largest decreases were recorded in **Spain** (-6.9%), **Slovakia** (-5.8%) and **Germany** (-1.2%).

## Geographical information

Up to 31 December 2022, the **euro area (EA19)** included Belgium, Germany, Estonia, Ireland, Greece, Spain, France, Italy, Cyprus, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, the Netherlands, Austria, Portugal, Slovenia, Slovakia and Finland. From 1 January 2023 the **euro area (EA20)** also includes Croatia.

The aggregate data series commented on in this News Release refer to the official composition of the euro area in the most recent month for which data is available. Thus, News Releases with data for months up to December 2022 comment on EA19 series, while Releases with data for January 2023 onwards will comment on EA20 series.

The **European Union (EU27)** includes Belgium, Bulgaria, Czechia, Denmark, Germany, Estonia, Ireland, Greece, Spain, France, Croatia, Italy, Cyprus, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Hungary, Malta, the Netherlands, Austria, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovenia, Slovakia, Finland and Sweden.

Estonia, Greece, Croatia, Cyprus, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg and Malta are not required to supply monthly data within 1 month and 15 days after the end of the reference month under Regulation (EU) 2019/2152. Ireland has a derogation to remain with quarterly frequency and Denmark to have a longer deadline until the end of 2023.

## Methods and definitions

The **index of production in construction** approximates the evolution of the volume of production within the sector, broken down into building construction and civil engineering.

**Seasonally adjusted** euro area and EU series are calculated by aggregating the seasonally adjusted national data. Eurostat carries out the seasonal adjustment of the data for those countries that do not adjust their data for seasonal effects.

The monthly index as presented in this News Release is calculated only on the basis of the data of those countries reporting monthly data. Missing observations from Member States for recent months are estimated for the calculation of the euro area and the EU aggregates.

## Revisions and timetable

Data of previous months have been revised compared with those issued in News Release [142/2022](#) of 19 December 2022. The monthly percentage change for October 2022 was revised from +1.3% to +1.0% in both the euro area and the EU. The annual percentage change has been revised from +2.2% to +1.9% in the euro area and from +2.4% to +2.2% in the EU.
